

# **IDAHO PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION**

## **MINUTES OF DECISION MEETING**

### **SUBJECT TO APPROVAL**

**July 22nd, 2025 – 1:30 p.m.**

In attendance was Commissioner Lodge and Commissioner John R. Hammond, Jr. Commissioner Hardie was participated remotely. Commissioner Lodge called the meeting to order.

The first order of business was the **ADOPTION OF THE PROPOSED AMENDED AGENDA** for April 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2025.

Commissioner Lodge made a motion, under Idaho Code § 74-204, to amend the agenda, adding Action Items No. 9 and 10 to the **CONSENT AGENDA**, Action Item No. 4: Adam Triplett's July 22, 2025, Decision Memorandum re: In the Matter of Commission Staff's Application for Approval of a Filing Process for Wildfire Mitigation Plans; Case No. GNR-E-25-02. A vote was taken on the motion and it carried unanimously.

The next order of business was the **APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE PREVIOUS MEETING** on April 15th, 2025. The Commission voted unanimously to approve the minutes as written.

The next order of business was **CONSENT AGENDA**:

**4. Action Item: Adam Triplett's July 22, 2025, Decision Memorandum re: In the Matter of Commission Staff's Application for Approval of a Filing Process for Wildfire Mitigation Plans; Case No. GNR-E-25-02.**

Commissioner Lodge made a motion to approve Staff's recommendations for Items 2 through 4 under the Consent Agenda. A vote was taken on the motion, and it carried unanimously.

The last order of business was **MATTERS IN PROGRESS**:

**5. Action Item: Erika Melanson's July 22, 2025, Decision Memorandum re: In the Matter of the Application of Idaho Power Company for Authority to Increase Its Rates and Charges for Electric Service in the State of Idaho; Case No. IPC-E-25-16.**

Mrs. Melanson presented the memorandum regarding Northwest Energy Coalition's late filing of their petition to intervene. NWECC explained they were aware of the deadline and noted the delay was due to prioritization of other work. Additionally, NWECC committed to following all existing schedules and avoiding undue delays.

Commissioner Lodge made a motion to approve NWECC's petition to intervene on the condition that the company complies with all deadlines and procedural requirements. A vote was taken on the motion, and it carried unanimously.
