## MINUTES OF DECISION MEETING

In attendance was Commissioner John R. Hammond, Jr., Commissioner Lodge and Commissioner Hardie. Commissioner Hammond called the meeting to order.

Commissioner Hammond made a motion to approve Staff's recommendations for Items 2 through 9 under the Consent Agenda. A commission vote was taken on the motion, and it carried unanimously.

The next order of business was MATTERS IN PROGRESS:

10. Action Item: Jeffrey R. Loll's August 5, 2025, Decision Memorandum re: In the Matter of the Application of Idaho Power Company for Authority to Update Its Operation and Maintenance Charges Applicable to Schedule 72, Generator Interconnections to PURPA Qualifying Facility Sellers; Case No. IPC-E-25-22.

Mr. Loll presented the memorandum regarding Idaho Power's Application for Authority to Update Its Operation and Maintenance Charges Applicable to Schedule 72, Generator Interconnections to PURPA Qualifying Facility Sellers.

Mr. Sanger representing Renewable Energy Coalition participated telephonically. Idaho Power Company and IdaHydro also participated and were present during the meeting.

Mr. Loll continued stating Idaho Power Company requested that this matter be processed by a modified procedure. Staff agrees with that position. However, within its petition to intervene, IdaHydro objected to the company's request for modified procedure and included a written description of its objections.

Mr. Erickson representing IdaHydro presented two main objections to modified procedure (1) the case originated as an issue separated from a prior rate case; the intention was not to forfeit hearing or cross-examination (2) the topic, though a component of a rate case, is complex and warrant a full review.

Mr. Walker, representing Idaho Power Company, asserted that the application follows a stipulated update to O&M charges as agreed in the 2023 rate case. The company views modified procedure as appropriate according to Commission rules, clarifying how modified procedures are set (Rules 201-204). He also emphasized timetables with the possibility of a request for a hearing, if justified. And lastly, he noted that extended discovery might fit within a modest schedule adjustment.

The commission, in agreeance with all participating parties, decided to allow all parties and staff's legal representation to open discussions and come to a consensus of a scheduling timeline. At the conclusion of these discussions, all parties agreed to the following deadlines: (1) an Initial Comment Deadline of September 16, 2025, (2) an All Party Reply Comment Deadline of October 7, 2025, and a (3) Company Reply Comment Deadline of October 14, 2025.

Commissioner Hardie made a motion for the Commission to process the Idaho Power O&M charge update via modified procedure, with agreed upon comment deadlines. A vote was taken on the motion, and it carried unanimously.
