Included below is a letter we sent to Israel Ray (May 11, 2008) expressing our concern over the planned price increase for Atlanta Power seasonal customers. We have been paying a power bill in Atlanta since 1982. We became seasonal users of Atlanta power in 1992 using approximately 300KWh per year. As stated below, we understand that Atlanta Power must be able to cover its expenses and make a profit. However, from our perspective, we cannot afford to pay \$1000 per year for 300KWh of power. That's not good business sense for us. This is a seasonal home that is used on a limited basis.

Therefore, as stated below, we will no longer be customers of Atlanta Power if our bill is doubled. We will take ourselves off the Atlanta Power grid and run our own power. I understand that this is a hassle for us, but in the long run, I feel that if the Idaho PUC approves the doubling of our power bill, we will have no alternative.

Israel:

Carol and I have supported Atlanta Power Co. for the last 15 years or so as seasonal customers. Prior to that we were full time customers. We have always paid our bill on time and have never shut the power off seasonally. Our annual power bill is approximately \$480. This includes the approximately 280 KWh we use each year.

I understand that the actual KWh used does not impact the overhead costs and operating costs of the Atlanta Power operation. However, please consider our side of the equation. Our power bill will now double to approximately \$1000 annually. That's approximately \$3.50 per KWh used on our part. It was already a stretch for us to have power at \$500 per year; \$1000 per year prices us out of the power grid in Atlanta.

I've done the math several times. Even with increased fuel costs, it will only take us about three years (compared to the new rates) to offset the cost of a generator for our Atlanta cabin. Sure, it is more convenient to flip a switch, however at some point, \$ outweigh convenience. I feel like the seasonal customers are bearing the brunt of this price hike.

In summary, Atlanta Power Company will lose us as customers if the seasonal rate goes away. I understand that you have to keep your company profitable, but I've got to look out for us. Please reconsider the "doubling" of our power bill in Atlanta.
