I am shocked at the requested rate hike for residential electric service and am seriously concerned how this rate hike will impact many areas of Idaho where people struggle daily to pay utilities throughout the Winter months and into Spring. Granted Avista does offer programs for its customers, but many are on the edge of qualifying for these programs.

In my opinion a fair increase at this time would be **half** of what they are asking for Residential – schedule 1 and limiting the Basic Monthly fee increase to \$11.00. In addition, the increase in the Street & Area Lights – Schedule 41-49, that cost will filter down to residents that live in some towns as it is added to the monthly bill for services provided.
