Avista's income from the sale of electricity in 2022 was \$155.2 million (from Avista's web site). An increase of 19.2% would equal almost \$30 million. I am writing to ask the Commission to moderate Avista's request by at least half the amount requested, \$15 million, in the interest of maintaining the budgets of the almost 400,000 Avista Idaho electric customers.
