On March 31, 2025, Avista Corporation, doing business as Avista Utilities ("Company") filed an application ("Application") with the Idaho Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") for an order approving the update in costs and administrative changes to the Company's Electric Line Extension Schedule 51 tariff ("Schedule 51").

On May 22, 2025, the Commission issued Order No. 36613 approving the Company's update to the Costs for Schedule 51, with an effective date of June 1, 2025. Additionally, Order No. 36613 required the Company to update the tariff language in Schedule 51 to include "all customers" with a load request who require an impact study pay for the cost.

On May 27, 2025, the Company filed an updated tariff sheet ("Compliance Filing"), to comply with Order No. 36613, with language specifying that "all customers" with a load request which requires an impact study will pay for the cost.

COMMISSION FINDINGS AND DECISION

The Commission has jurisdiction over the Company's Application and the issues in this case under Title 61 of the Idaho Code including *Idaho Code* §§ 61-301 through 303. The Commission is empowered to investigate rates, charges, rules, regulations, practices, and contracts of all public utilities and to determine whether they are just, reasonable, preferential, discriminatory, or in violation of any provisions of law, and to fix the same by order. *Idaho Code* §§ 61-501 through 503.

Having reviewed the record and the Company's Compliance Filing, the Commission finds that the Company has complied with Order No. 36613 to update the tariff language in Schedule 51 to include "all customers" with a load request who require an impact study pay for the cost, as filed.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the updated Schedule 51 contained in the Compliance Filing submitted on May 27, 2025, is approved, effective June 1, 2025.

THIS IS A FINAL ORDER. Any person interested in this Order may petition for reconsideration within twenty-one (21) days of the service date upon this Order regarding any matter decided in this Order. Within seven (7) days after any person has petitioned for reconsideration, any other person may cross-petition for reconsideration. *Idaho Code* § 61-626.
