To clarify, the statement I made was:

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16 <u>"</u>Idaho Power is able to forecast 17 distribution circuit and substation capacity 18 requirements with some certainty five years 19 into the future. This planning horizon 20 period allows the Company to investigate 21 options to avoid facility overloads, select 22 more cost-effective options, and design and 23 construct improvements to meet the 24 identified overloads.²⁵

I did not suggest that distribution benefits resulting from customers with on-site generation will be limited to a five-year period as such benefit determination is outside the scope of this docket.
