Comment: When moving to Idaho a year ago I was initially disappointed to learn that the state lacked a statewide requirement of net metering for solar. I was then encouraged that our electric provider, Idaho Power, nonetheless offered net metering. Partly on that basis, my wife and I invested in solar installation at our home.

I was further encouraged by Idaho Power's recent announcement of a 2045 goal of 100% clean power.

It now seems to be a step backward if Idaho Power is requesting the Commission in this proceeding to consider reducing the rate credited or paid to residential customers for excess power generated by their solar. I understand Idaho Power is concerned that the current tariff does not capture all costs or is unfair to other customers. However, reducing the net metering rate would not be fair to customers like us who have already invested in solar, and would undermine incentives to achieve clean energy.
