While some would advocate the elimination of residential net metering customers by removing all financial incentives to invest in small scale solar power generation as the best solution for a diversified clean energy future, I am hopeful that the PUC is not willing to eliminate solar net metering customers altogether in its efforts to address the unequal cost distributions concerns in the current rate structure as proposed by the Idaho Power Company. While I am sure both Idaho Power and the PUC work together to provide the fairest rate structures for all customer classes it would be interesting to identify as close as possible what that actual cost transference (by net metering customers)"is" and how offensive it may be, in consideration of other realized cost inequities already being absorbed by Idaho Power customers within the conservation of energy programs provided by Idaho Power.
