On April 5, 2019, the Company filed an Application requesting the Commission initiate a collaborative process to study the continued reasonableness of terms in Schedule 84 for commercial, industrial, and irrigation net metering customers. The Company requested Schedule 84 be suspended to new applicants as of April 5, 2019, while the case was processed.

On April 18, 2019, the Commission issued a Notice of Application and Notice of Procedural Comment Deadline. Order No. 34315. The Commission determined the Company had not demonstrated Schedule 84 should be closed to new applicants during the pendency of the case, and therefore suspended the Company's proposed effective date. *Id.* By statute, the maximum time the Commission could initially suspend the proposed effective date was for 5 months plus 30 days. *Idaho Code* § 61-622(4). The Commission suspended the effective date for the maximum initial statutory amount, which was until October 7, 2019. Order No. 34315.

On September 10, 2019, the Company submitted a letter consenting to extend the suspension of the proposed effective date until November 15, 2019.

On November 15, 2019, the Commission issued a Notice of Continued Suspension of Effective Date, which suspended the proposed effective date for an additional sixty days, until January 14, 2020, so the parties could continue the collaborative process. Order No. 34488.

On January 14, 2020, the Commission issued another Notice of Continued Suspension of Effective Date, which suspended the proposed effective date for an additional sixty days, until March 16, 2020, so the parties could determine the proper course of action, given Order No. 34509.


At the March 10, 2020, Decision Meeting, Commission Staff recommended the Commission continue to suspend the effective date because the parties had not yet been able to meet to determine the proper course of action in light of Order No. 34509 and the Commission's final order on reconsideration in IPC-E-18-15, Order No. 34546.

Based on Staff's representation that the parties had not yet been able to meet as contemplated in Order No. 34546, we find good cause exists to suspend the proposed effective date by another 60 days. Accordingly, pursuant to *Idaho Code* § 61-622, we will continue to suspend the Company's proposed effective date to allow time to determine how Commission Order Nos. 34509 and 34546 impact this docket.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED the Company's proposed effective date be suspended until May 15, 2020.




