On November 4, 2021, Idaho Power Company ("Company") applied to the Commission for authority to establish a new schedule to serve speculative high-density customers—specifically, large-scale cryptocurrency mining operators.

On December 1, 2021, the Commission issued a Notice of Application, and Notice of Intervention Deadline. Order No. 35241.

On December 28, 2021, the Industrial Customers of Idaho Power ("ICIP") and 2140 Labs LLC ("2140 Labs") intervened in this case. Order No. 35276.

The Commission now issues this Notice of Modified Procedure establishing deadlines for public comments and the Company's reply.

NOTICE OF MODIFIED PROCEDURE

YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED that the Commission has determined that the public interest may not require a formal hearing in this matter, and it will review the case through written submissions under the Commission's Rules of Modified Procedure Rules 201 through 204 of the Idaho Public Utilities Commission's Rules of Procedure, IDAPA 31.01.01.201-204. The Commission notes that Modified Procedure and written comments have proven to be an effective means for obtaining public input and participation.

YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED that persons desiring to state a position on this Application may file a written comment explaining why they support or oppose the Application. Persons who would like a hearing must specifically request a hearing in their written comments. **Persons shall have until April 12, 2022, to file written comments.** Comments must be filed through the Commission's website or by e-mail unless computer access is unavailable. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this case be processed by Modified Procedure, Rule 201-204 (IDAPA 31.01.01.201 - .204). Persons shall have until April 12, 2022, to file written comments, and the Company shall have until April 26, 2022, to file a reply.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that parties should continue to comply with Order No. 35058, issued June 3, 2021. All pleadings should be filed with the Commission electronically and shall be deemed timely filed when received by the Commission Secretary. *See* Rule 14.02. Service between parties should also be accomplished electronically. Voluminous discovery-related documents may be filed and served on CD-ROM or a USB flash drive.
