FINDINGS OF FACT

We find that no party timely opposed these Petitions to Intervene.

We further find that based on the pleadings and other documents filed in this case, intervention by these parties would serve the purposes of intervention as described by Rule 74 of the Commission’s Rules of Procedure and should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Petition to Intervene filed by the Kluckhohns, *pro se*, is granted.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Petition to Intervene filed by Micron, is granted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all parties comply with all rules of the Commission including Rules of Procedure 43, 71-75, and 222-223 of the Idaho Public Utilities Commission, IDAPA 31.01.01.043, 071-.075, .222-.223.


