ORDER NO. 35840

The Idaho Hydroelectric Power Producers Trust, an Idaho Trust, d/b/a IdaHydro ("IdaHydro") petitioned to intervene in this case on June 20, 2023, and Micron Technology, Inc. ("Micron") petitioned to intervene in this case on June 21, 2023. Both petitions were filed pursuant to Idaho Public Utilities Commission Rules of Procedure 71-75, IDAPA 31.01.01.071-.075.

FINDINGS OF FACT

We find that no party timely opposed these Petitions to Intervene.
