On March 28, 2025, the Idaho Irrigation Pumpers Association ("IIPA") filed a late petition to intervene in the proceeding. No one opposed IIPA's petition. Having reviewed the record, we conditionally grant IIPA's petition as follows.

## **FINDINGS**

Commission Order No. 36476 set a March 17, 2025, deadline for petitions to intervene. IIPA filed its petition to intervene on March 28, 2025. IIPA's petition is, therefore, untimely.

Untimely petitions to intervene are governed by Rules 71-75, IDAPA 31.01.01.071-.075. Based on the record, we find that IIPA has shown good cause for the untimely filing, and that it has a direct and substantial interest in this proceeding and will not unduly broaden the issues. We thus find it reasonable to grant IIPA's untimely petition to intervene on the condition that IIPA not delay, disrupt, or unduly broaden the issues in this proceeding. We note that, per Rule 73, IIPA is bound by all prior orders and notices issued in the case.

## **ORDER**

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that IIPA's petition to intervene is granted on the conditions specified above.
