The city of Boise City (“Boise City”) and the Industrial Customers of Idaho Power (“ICIP”) petitioned to intervene in this case on April 24, 2026, pursuant to Idaho Public Utilities Commission Rules of Procedure 71-75, IDAPA 31.01.01.071-.075.

FINDINGS OF FACT

We find that no party timely opposed these Petitions to Intervene.


