Micron Technology, Inc. (“Micron”) petitioned to intervene in this case on April 28, 2026, and the Federal Executive Agencies (“FEA”) petitioned to intervene in this case on April 30, 2026, pursuant to Idaho Public Utilities Commission Rules of Procedure 71-75, IDAPA 31.01.01.071-.075.

FINDINGS OF FACT

We find that no party timely opposed these Petitions to Intervene.

We further find that based on the pleadings and other documents filed in this case, intervention by these parties would serve the purposes of intervention as described by Rule 74 and should be granted.




