I live across the river from the Dworshak dam and see and listened to water being spilled most of the summer. Not only does this foul up my fishing it cost me money. This water should be going through the turbines making cheap power not wasted. The Northwest Power people spend money like drunken sailors on projects that are not proven to help fish. It takes fishery biologist from Canada with much smaller budgets to prove that it is the ocean not the dams causing the big problem.
