Comment: As an ex oil-company geophysicist and now as a practicing environmental engineer (since 1987), I have seen how oil/gas drilling can ruin pristine water supplies such as the one that the Eagle Water Company manages for the fast-growing City of Eagle. So what has oil/gas drilling have to do with the current attempt by SUEZ to buy the Eagle Water Company? EVERYTHING! Aside from the inevitable "need" by large water management companies (ie, SUEZ) to "over-treat" water supplies, SUEZ will be able, through its ownership of our water supply to ship it wherever it wants, as well as allowing oil/gas drillers to use HUGE amounts of water for basic (non-fracking) drilling operations. Aside from the inevitable 300% rate increase that SUEZ has stated will occur, they will have the ability to NEVER DENY aquifer-killing oil/gas drillers like Alta Mesa (currently in Payette County) to venture further east over our pristine aquifer and potentially ruin it forever! Idahoans seem to think that only fracking can ruin water supplies, yet the actual process of drilling a simple oil/gas well can also have deleterious impacts upon a water supply, let alone the unsightly surface disturbances it creates!

When I lived in Broussard, LA (west of New Orleans) back in 1984, I built a new home in a beautiful neighborhood, only to soon experience an oil/gas rig setting up next-door and drilling 24/7/365. Even in Louisiana, where such sights are common, it was NOT a good thing to have next door! If an outside MULTINATIONAL firm like SUEZ buys Eagle Water, I fear that their concern for our local quality of life (nice scenery and pristine drinking water) will be sufficiently low, to allow oil/gas drilling in and around our beautiful community. If this happens, get ready to see a mass migration elsewhere, as property values will plummet in such a POSSIBLE event! Seeing how the City of Eagle is currently creating an ordinance to protect against environmentally destructive oil/gas drilling activities that may reach Eagle, I would much rather have the City of Eagle be able to make a future decision regarding how much water the oil/gas drillers get to use, in the REAL possibility that they hit an "oil/gas trend" that redirects their efforts our way.

PLEASE seriously consider how our quality of life and our property values will PLUMMET, when a relatively unconcerned multinational like SUEZ allows indiscriminate oil/gas drilling in/near Eagle and elsewhere in Ada County sometime in our very near future.
