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Dear Secretary:

As you know, we retained the right to "amend and plea further" in our response to the proposed order (Case # ATL-E-03-1).

The following is our second addendum.

Please refer to Orders # 24925 and 23367, p. 8, Schedule 5 Temporary kwh surcharge (4.5 cents/kwh).

There was no footnote in the order to remind AP that rates should be adjusted upon satisfaction of the note to IDWR Tr. pp. 152, 153.

Our understanding is that the note to IDWR for \$57,000 for installation of a hydraulic gate on top of the dam has now been paid off.

Has the 4.5 cents/kwh surcharge been removed? We do not see evidence that it has.

Furthermore, it is our understanding from reading PUC rules and regulations that, without a rate case, the above surcharge should not have become a permanent part of the rates for AP customers.

Therefore, it is our position that, if this surcharge has not been removed, overpayments due to the surcharge should be returned to AP customers for the period of time that began after the loan was paid off.
